Summary

2022's been a great year in so many ways – year three has easily been our best year so far. Coming slowly out of COVID restrictions has been hugely positive for our learners and appreciated by every adult here. It wasn't without challenges though: COVID still in the community, staffing shortages, variants exploding around the world, and everything in between. Saying all that, this has been our most normal year since opening. What a wild ride to start a new school. This year saw the return of Enrichment, Drama productions, Band concerts, a Band festival, an Outdoor Ed trip, a Grade 5 open house, a second playing field (albeit limited), PAC events, and a return to a semblance of regular routines for our kids and teachers. We couldn't be prouder of how hard everyone worked, and how amazing our kids (your children) are. From a learning perspective, our staff has really gelled and have united our work around common learning goals related to Learner Agency, and Learner Metacognition/Reflection. This work is important and has taken a year of focused time and effort, despite global pandemic distractions, to get us to where we are. Next year will see the staff take a deep dive in these areas with new learning and the implementation of strategies that will move us in the right direction.

As we finish this year, we are happy where the school is at given the tough journey we've all been on, and there still is so much room to grow which is exciting for us. Ideally, the world will continue to be open and learning environments flexible, and year four will shape up to be even better than year three. We're proud of the work and are excited about the possibilities ahead.

Year-End Celebrations: Dates to Note

- Tuesday, June 28 is the Bertram Beach day for the Fox, Kokanee, and Deer communities Presentations of Learning
- We are inviting families to CMS for their child's Presentation of Learning on June 27th or 28th. These presentations are a way to share how they'; ve grown in their Core Competencies (thinking, communicating and personal/social awareness) through all the learning they've done this year. They will be conversation style presentations like you would see at a science fair or art gallery with students spread about the gym and community rooms to allow for conversations about learning between you and your student.
- We are hoping that each student will be able to have at least one trusted adult who could attend their 10 min presentation at some point during their 45 min time slot. This could be a

parent, aunt/uncle, grandparent, or trusted family friend. More than one adult is always welcome! So, it's time to start thinking about who will be able to attend the presentation for your learner! We'll be sending out a sign up in the next few weeks so make sure every learner has a person to celebrate their learning with them.

Staffing Updates

- We're in the middle of the third round of teacher postings. There will be additional rounds, but we're waiting to see. We've been extremely lucky with our postings and are getting great people.
- o Some have posted out, and some are going on maternity leave next year we do work under a collective agreement, allowing people to take leaves and post every year o Nolan, Kaitlyn, Dustin, Brendan, and Alanna will be missed
- Community teams have not been finalized yet. Once all the dust settles, we will look at placements. Continuity in communities is a priority.

Yearbooks

- The yearbooks have arrived. We haven't set a date yet for distribution, but likely during the final full week of classes (ie. next week). Information will be coming home as soon as that's planned
- As always, we do not have replacement books if there are yearbooks defaced or lost. Teachers will be discussing appropriate yearbook expectations with every student in each community prior to handing them out.
